Right now, we are focused on the urgent opportunity to capitalize on the dramatic increase in desire for Christian education right across Canada. How can we Unlock Access to Christian education for more and more students?

How did we get here?

COVID-19 brought new attention to our approaches to education. Certain ideological impulses in publicly-funded schools, and the influx of immigrants who desire Christian education, means Christian schools across the country have the opportunity to offer a life changing Christian Education to more students than ever before.

How shall we respond?

You can join in Unlocking Access for more and more students by opening these five doors.

Door #1: **Abundant and Accessible Tuition Assistance.** You – our donors – are already making use of the Foundation's tuition assistance programs to make a huge difference in the lives of hundreds of students. We can quickly and effectively scale these to reach significantly more students.

Door #2: Funds to Support Building Projects, Creating More Space in Existing Christian Schools. With the growing demand for Christian eduction, there is a need for many existing schools to expand or start satellite campuses. Schools are keen to open their doors widely to accept more students, including students with disabilities and those with an interest in the skilled trades.

Door #3: **Establishing New Christian Schools.** Communities in under-served areas are ready to start new Christian schools across the country. You can provide the support they need to get off to a strong start through our Foundation.

Door #4: Addressing Teacher Pay. More students require more teachers. In a time of national teacher shortages, how do Christian schools attract and retain excellent staff members who are professionally competent and missionally-aligned? We have a plan to address this challenge!

Door #5: **Strong Associations.** Christian schools – new ones and established ones – have considerably better prospects of thriving into the future if they work together. Unlocking access to the latest research along with thoughtful, professional government advocacy through supportive industry associations is a key way to make this moment of growth sustainable.

Tell Them!

While Christian schools may differ in aspects of their mission, vision, governance and policies, they all share the common core mission of telling them!

Deuteronomy 6 commands parents, grandparents and teachers to share stories of God's faithfulness with children at every opportunity – when walking the paths of life or relaxing at home. Constant reminders of God's faithfulness and His call to love Him and our neighbours as ourselves, is a reason many parents choose Christian schools.

Manna in the Wilderness

God provided manna to teach his people to trust Him and to remove their concern for daily necessities. Developing quiet confidence around their basic needs allowed them to focus on other essentials, namely, "What does it mean to be the people of God?"

Christian education is a demanding endeavor. School leaders are under pressure to provide excellent Christ-centered education while keeping costs in line. These leaders are charged with ensuring their schools faithfully navigate complex topics in this cultural moment.

Christian school leaders need to be laser-focused on faithfully and persistently sharing the story of God's love, grace and faithfulness. However, they frequently spend inordinate time and energy meeting the basic needs of the school: balancing the budget, funding renovations or building new learning spaces. While these are vital tasks, they can demand a tremendous amount of attention.

This is where school supporters and donors play a critical role – and where the Christian School Foundation can be a real blessing! Like manna, donations can alleviate the stress of meeting basic needs and free leaders and boards to focus on other essentials. Because donations come in many forms and sizes – one-time gifts, monthly contributions, capital gifts, investment gifts (shares) and gifts in your Will, to name a few, the Foundation can be a most helpful asset to schools.

Consternation to Confidence






