EMERGENCY BRIDGE BURSARY

How working together makes us stronger

n stormy weather, it helps to have a solid Foundation. When the great COVID-19 disruption caused March Break to be extended, there was a great deal of uncertainty. What would be the economic impact? Who might lose their job? Who would be unable to meet the tuition obligations needed to keep their children enrolled in their Christian school?

Schools that were part of the Christian School Foundation witnessed first-hand the benefits of working together.

First, the Foundation's diversified and balanced investment strategy meant that school funds ended the year in positive territory, despite the tumultuous times in the markets.

Second, the Foundation was able to allocate 5% to those schools whose funds were not locked away in permanent endowments.

Third, schools who had accessible funds given them by supporters, often years before there was anything called COVID-19, had a fallback fund that was ready to provide security for unforeseen circumstances.

Finally – and almost immediately – schools were able to apply for the Foundation's rapidly implemented Emergency Bridge Bursary, which saw \$160,000 sent out to 58 schools in support of 115 families. This bursary kept those families connected to their local Christian schools until the dust settled and the school year drew to a close. The funds for this Bursary were provided by donors both past and current who stepped forward to address this very pressing need!

There is a great deal that remains unsettled as the ripples of the pandemic continue to cause disruption. But to this point, one thing did shine through with clarity: we are stronger together as partners in the Christian School Foundation. †

FINANCIAL LITERACY COURSE

From local idea to larger reality

hen Kevin and Karen Antonides noticed a need for a robust financial literacy curriculum at their local Christian school, they discovered this was a need that went beyond just their area schools. Not only was their local Christian school looking to create something new, but many Christian schools saw this need, and in fact their provincial government had committed to creating a new financial literacy course of study. It was an idea whose time had come, and the Antonides' turned to the Christian School Foundation to see if we could help make this happen.

In partnership with the Edvance Christian Schools Association, the Foundation was able to take Kevin and Karen's generous gift and address the need they had recognized. Edvance Director of Learning Justin Cook took the lead on coordinating this effort by collaborating with Anneke Gretton (a recent John Rozema Teaching Excellence Award winner) as she crafted and tested the new course's components. The Foundation provided the resources and some networking - most notably with Kevin McCarthy of Enriched Academy, who is also a board member at Burlington Christian Academy, a Foundation member school.

The result is a flexible series of course modules that teach financial literacy from a Christian perspective. These can be implemented in various places across a school's curriculum. They are modules that work very well when taught online, in a hybrid setting, or in-person.

This kind of collaborative effort among partners who work well together can accomplish many things that strengthen Christian schools! 




Specific to our past fiscal year, the Foundation's diversified investment strategy meant that school funds ended the June 30th fiscal year in positive territory, despite turbulence created by the pandemic. And for schools where their long-term assets were not locked away in permanent endowments, the Foundation was able to gift them a net return of 5%.
